

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SUBAIKA PARVEEN

Girls are supposed to have responsibilities on their shoulders. One such individual is Subaika Parveen who has been challenging her efforts for the welfare of herself as well as her family. Subaika Parveen is a student of Class 8 in Middle School at Jhingnagar in Bihar Sharif. Parveen is the eldest and has 6 members in the family which includes 5 siblings and her mother, in the Badi Dargah area of Bihar Sharif. Subaika is one amongst the beneficiary under the BACHPAN Project of Stitching Kinderpostzegels (SKN) Nederland, under which she was identified for support program for education. She shares that her identification was conducted when she was a kid. Since then, she has been performing exceptionally well and is making her family proud. Subaika Parveen, is doing her best in academics and is learning a lot more in life ethics and moral values. She speaks in a different way and grasps and adapts things in a different way.

But life of Subaika is not that smooth, being the eldest daughter, she ought to have several responsibilities of the family. Amongst all these responsibilities, she has been witnessing the critical illness of her brother since his birth. The illness is that the boy has got Vascular disorders and there is a deformation of muscles around his stomach. According to her mother, this abnormality of her child has been diagnosed already but the doctors warn against any operations, as it might danger the boy's life. This stress and anxiety have also impacted on Parveen's mother's health. Hence, Subaika is fighting with double responsibilities against illness.

She also shares that there was a time when her mother and all the children settled to their grandmother's house to get an ease against her father. This statement of her indicated that the household environment was not at all friendly and to which lacked education. As soon as the family shifted to Jhingnagar, the team identified their need and processed the education of Subaika.


She says that the education has helped her to think and act in diverse ways, for which, she is now aware of her rights and aspires to spread awareness and uplift to all who are in need.





CHILD PROTECTION

20,000+ Children freed from Child Labour
500 Kids put under the alternative care

One such story is of a 16-year boy; Manu Kumar is a son of Vijay Bhuiyan and is a resident of Surleti village of Nawada district of Bihar. As said, poverty pushes every of the family into livelihood generation by either means of way. The family suffered financial catastrophe due to which Manu along with his siblings involved in collection of Mica in the nearby mines and labour work in another district. It happened to have been one year after 12th since he left his studies and entered labour work. His selection to work as labour has deep connections with the customs of community to become earning member of the family. The entire population is dependent on Mica collection, wood picking from gungles, and other forms of labour work to earn livelihood. For an evanescent amount of money followed by this work leading to high morbidity shatters the family economy. One important reason of him being involved in the hazardous work in the adolescent age was the lack of basic and essential facilities such as availability of schools and tuition in the village. Manu was counselled session aimed to firstly give him a psychological aid against what he had been through during his labour work and also focused on understanding his personality traits so that he could be educated and lead his life in the society, Golu was counselled and then connected to Bal Manch and community library in the village, where now he is paralleling himself with his studies. He is also giving tuition to younger children and trying to educate them. He is flourishing himself as the new hope of the village.

GOVINDA BHOGATA

Govinda Bhoga, lives with his 2 young children and wife in the Paratouniya village of Rajauli Block. Govinda's village is one of the most deprived villages of essential government services like Anganwadi and primary school for children in the village due to being settled in dense forests. From last many years he was surviving his families from picking and selling of MICA after collection, he does not have his own land for agriculture work. This reason leads him to face a lot of problem in maintaining his family's need in survival and education of his children.

Due to poor financial condition and illiteracy, Govinda could not switch to any entrepreneurial activity or employment but after discussion with him, he found that he is very much interested in starting small type of business. Since Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad has been working for the last 2 years for the overall development of mica dependent families in Rajauli block. Govinda was helped to start his self-employment through the organization. Since Govinda had never done any business before, he had no experience of any kind of business. The institution got information about his experiences from GovindaBhoga, he said that he had worked at a fast-food shop once, long back. On the basis of dedication, commitment as well as his interest, the organization decided to assist him in opening fast-food shops. Based on the discussion and his commitment, BJUP has provided the essential materials and goods to GovindaBhoga for starting a fast-food shop, it was above INR 10,000. Govinda started the fast-food shop from his home and informed the villagers about his shop. Through GovindaBhoga, the villagers came to know that a fast-food shop has opened in their village, Veg-chowmein, egg-chowmein, veg-roll, eggroll, Fry-omelette, half-fry omelette, bread-dumplings, potato tikka, etc. is offered at Govinda's shop.

Govinda is still associated with Mica work, but now he also has a business of his own for extra income. Govinda's wife also assists Govinda in this new business, such as preparing raw materials. The income of new business helps Govinda in the maintenance of the family. Govinda's family's standard of living has improved due to improvement in economic condition. Now he is earning almost more than 5000 thousand in a month and

KALPANA KUMARI (NAME CHANGED)

Under the Targeted Intervention project, the organization has reached to families in need. This story is about one amongst the High-Risk Groups (HRGs) Kalpana Kumari (imaginary name) had a life of extreme vulnerability. She had led a life which has been in the epicentre of being highly risked in her community. This case of Kalpana Kumari revolves around the violence by her partner. She shares how her partner has been abusive to her both mentally and physically. All these information has been witnessed by the Project Facilitator of the organization and was presented in front of the Project Manager for instant support to her. The organization instantly supported her with the counselling first and her partner. According to her partner, she has slipped her feet in something which is very stigmatic. She comes home late in the night, even she stays late out from the home and doesn't return home sometimes.

Her partner believes that the violence is the right justice for her as she has crossed her boundaries of being a female. The team decided to have a transparent and clear communication with the individual, her partner, and the rest of the family. On discussing these things with her, she expressed that she does labour work, and it is often hectic and extra time consuming. Hence this automatically results in returning late to home. On this the entire family abuses her mentally and physically. She allegedly stated that she had been so brutally harassed that it bruised her back. She also stated that she had so much pain of the harassment that she could not even speak a word due to pain.

The entire family has been counselled on this incident and was elucidated to them. The individual sought counselling along with her family members by the team member from the organization and provided her with medical treatment for the injury. She was also provided the ration, food items for her instantly, and medicines for her speedy recovery.

OUR PROGRAMMES



BACHPAN

(A PROGRAM OF STITCHING KINDERPOSTZEGELS, NETHERLANDS)



“Building Atmosphere for Child's Holistic Development Protection and Nurturing” or BACHPAN is being contrived in the slum areas of Bihar Sharif town of Nalanda district of Bihar state. This project heads to the holistic development, protection and nurturing of the child, it also covers child labour, which is often defined as work that is harmful to physical and mental development and works for the children in three dynamics. Firstly, it provides Kinship care to the children who are without parents but living with nearest relatives, secondly, it provides support to the children who are living either with mother or father. And thirdly, it supports to the children who are not having either of the parents and not even with the nearest living, but siblings are living alone.

BACHPAN'S AIM:

The aim of the project lies around on the “Psycho-Social and Physical development of Children in need of care and protection for making them responsible and independent citizens of the country”.

BACHPAN

(A PROGRAM OF AZIM PREMJI PHILANTHROPHIC INITIATIVES)

The project BACHPAN is an initiative of Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives (APPI), Bangalore has been working in more than ten slum areas of Bihar Sharif, Nalanda district. The project is protecting children who are separated from their families for various reasons and nurturing them by creating a favourable conducive environment. The learning and field experience gained from BACHPAN pilot has been incorporated in the design of BACHPAN scale up to provide a comprehensive package of children who are vulnerable and in need of support and help. The project area is mainly inhabited by minorities, scheduled castes and other backward communities who are considered as the weakest sections of the society.

BACHPAN'S AIM:

The project aims at securing the childhood (BACHPAN) of the children who have ended up on the streets or are highly vulnerable to ending up on the streets in the town of Bihar Sharif and Rajgir. The project is a direct intervention for prevention, rescue, protection, and rehabilitation of children who have ended up living on streets and children who are vulnerable to end up living on streets. The project shall create a facilitating atmosphere among the citizens of Nalanda, families, community and the government machinery so that the neglected and victim children in need & support are provided with an enabling environment for his/her holistic development.



VIHAAN

(A GLOBAL FUND SUPPORTED PROJECT)

Vihaan is a national initiative on the issue of Care and Support for HIV/AIDS positive people. It is getting implemented by BJUP with the support of NCPI+. The project VIHAAN is managing 350 Care and Support Centres (CSCs) across India to expand access to essential services, increase treatment adherence, reduce stigma and discrimination, and improve the quality of life of people living with HIV (PLHIV). Vihaan CSCs through its intervention has reached to the last person of the line and has impacted lives of the people resulting into their awareness, self-health follow-ups and has awakened sensitization for each other. Under the project the running CSCs are committed to the health and wellbeing of all PLHIV and their affected families, with special effort to reach those from underserved populations, including women, children, and members of high-risk groups. VIHAAN provides access to range of quality care and support services using an integrated approach that complements existing HIV prevention and treatment programming. Working in coordination with nearby ART centres, CSCs are safe spaces for PLHIV offering services that include counselling, outreach and follow-up support health referrals, and linkages to social schemes.

VIHAAN's AIM:

To reach the long-term goal of improving the standard of life, reduction of stigma and discrimination from the life of PLHIV. To improve health and hygiene practices among PLHIV. Early linkages of PLHIV to care and support centre in treatment services. To improve nutritional support to PLHIV. To promote social protection and well-being of PLHIV. To improve enabling PLHIV friendly environment. To strengthen community system to reduce the stigma and discrimination.

COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT PROJECT

(A PROGRAM OF RESPONSIBLE MICA INITIATIVE)



The project Community Empowerment Program is an initiative project of Bhartiya Jan Utthan Parishad under the support of Responsible Mica Initiative, Paris, collaborate working with NGOs of Jharkhand namely, Abhivyakti Foundation (Giridih); Samajik Parivartan Sansthan (Giridih); and Samarpan (Koderma). Bhartiya Jan Utthan is the lead agency for the project and is working in 50 villages of Bihar and Jharkhand. The project is being implemented in 30 villages of Giridih and Koderma districts of Jharkhand state and 20 villages of Jamui and Rajauli districts in Bihar state.

The Community Empowerment Project aims to transform the community in the mica region for long-term and self-sustainable remedies to the underlying causes of poverty, vulnerability, illiteracy. The project had been launched back in 2018.

CEP's AIM:

CEP aims in strengthening the livelihood opportunities of the target communities by providing them with additional sources of livelihood in addition to their engagement in mica related work. It also inclines towards raising awareness of the communities on improving their health status especially about pregnant and lactating mothers and children up to 6 years of age by facilitating their access to Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) provided by the government. Improving the communities' access to quality education by engaging with local government schools and raising awareness at the community level on relevance and importance of education among children up to 14 years of age, as well as the immediate danger and long-term physical and psychological effects of child labour in mining environments.


